Caryl was born November 23, 1939, in Dexter, Iowa. She married her high school sweetheart, Bob Horn, in 1959. During their 43 years of marriage, they moved around in the early years because of military and oilfield, until they settled in Lafayette, La. in 1973. When her youngest child started school, she decided to try her hand at real estate. She started out as an agent but soon after became a relocation specialist. She worked for many years as the Relocation Director at Caldwell Banker Pelican Real Estate. She retired at age 70. Everyone who knew her knew that she was not a sedentary person. At retirement, she dedicated herself to volunteering and serving with her church. To mention a few, she would volunteer at Lafayette General Hospital every week, deliver Meals on Wheels once or twice a month, deliver communion and devotionals for her church once a month. She was ever the servant with a giving heart and generous soul, donating her time

and energy to those who needed help or encouragement.
