The family of Rosemary Aycock Domingues sadly announces her death on Tuesday, July 13, 2021. Rosemary was 92 when she peacefully passed away at Courtyard Manor Nursing Home in Lafayette.

A private inurnment ceremony will be in Bellevue Memorial Park Cemetery in Opelousas.

Rosie, as she was affectionately known, was born in Patterson, LA on October 28, 1928. She entered the Marianites of Holy Cross community and served for many years as a teacher before becoming an RN and the first Director of Nursing at Opelousas General Hospital. Rosie changed career paths and would begin a career at Lafayette General Medical Center as the Director of Nursing. After a successful career in caring for others, Rosie would join the faculty of USL as a professor of nursing. After touching many lives on campus, she became an inspector of nursing homes until her retirement.

Survivors include her niece, Jennifer E Aycock; her nephews, Thomas W. Aycock, Andrew M. Aycock, and Joel Brent Aycock and her sister in law, Katharine Aycock.

She was preceded in death by her beloved husband, Murphy John Domingues; her parents, Dr. John Buell Aycock and the former Pearl Rose Fields Aycock; her brothers, Dr. John B. Aycock Jr. and Adrian Marius Aycock.
